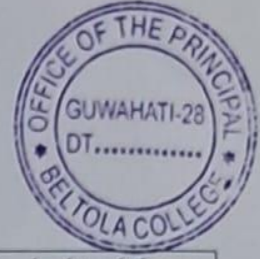

Sub:- Representation of Other Backward Classes and More Other Backward Classes with other Reserved Categories in Public Services.

Consequence upon the amendments made in the Assam Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Reservation in Vacancies and Posts) 1978, and in modification of earlier notification No. TAD/BC/283/2003/05 dtd. 20.12.2005 the following hundred point model roster is adopted for giving effect the reservation of vacancies for reserved categories including OBC.

The Roster for OBC and MOBC category shall be adopted for the purpose of direct recruitment only by each establishment for each cadre.

In absence of qualified reserved candidates in a particular year the vacancies shall be carried forward till the requisite percentage of reservation in that of cadre is filled up.

These guidelines shall come into force with immediate effect. All the appointing authorities under the State Govt. will strictly follow the instruction and any difficulties/dispute arises should be promptly referred to WPT & BC Deptt.



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**National Policy for Persons with Disabilities**

**Introduction**

The Constitution of India ensures equality, freedom, justice and dignity of all individuals and implicitly mandates an inclusive society for all including persons with disabilities. In the recent years, there have been vast and positive changes in the perception of the society towards persons with disabilities. It has been realized that a majority of persons with disabilities can lead a better quality of life if they have equal opportunities and effective access to rehabilitation measures.

2. According to the Census 2001, there are 2.19 crore persons with disabilities in India who constitute 2.13 percent of the total population. This includes persons with visual, hearing, speech, locomotor and mental disabilities. Seventy five per cent of persons with disabilities live in rural areas, 49 per cent of disabled population is literate and only 34 per cent are employed. The earlier emphasis on medical rehabilitation has now been replaced by an emphasis on social rehabilitation. There has been an increasing recognition of abilities of persons with disabilities and emphasis on mainstreaming them in the society based on their capabilities. The Government of India has enacted three legislations for persons with disabilities viz.



27. Persons with disabilities will be provided access to the Universities, technical institutions and other institutions of higher learning to pursue higher and professional courses.

### **II C Economic Rehabilitation of Persons with Disabilities**

28. Economic rehabilitation of Persons with disabilities comprise of both wage employment in organized sector and self-employment. Supporting structure of services by way of vocational rehabilitation centres and vocational training centres will be developed to ensure that disabled persons in both urban and rural areas have increased opportunities for productive and gainful employment. Strategies for economic empowerment of persons with disabilities would be the following.

#### **(i) Employment in Government Establishments**

The PWD Act, 1995 provides for 3% reservation in employment in the establishments of Government of India and Public Sector Undertakings (PSUs) against identified posts. The status of reservation for Government in various Ministries/ Departments against identified posts in Group A, B, C & D is 3.07%, 4.41%, 3.76% and 3.18% respectively. In PSUs, the reservation status in Group A, B, C & D is 2.78%, 8.54%, 5.04% and 6.75%, respectively. Government will ensure reservation in identified posts in the Government sector including public sector undertakings in accordance with the provisions of the PWD Act, 1995. The list of identified posts, which was notified in 2001, will be reviewed and updated.
